# COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

April 10, 2018

## LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORTS

### Pastoral Leadership Team and Worship Commission – Jon Carlson

**Things completed:** Staff retreat day and the worship survey with discussion session. **Current matters:** Continuing the sermon series on *Our Story* – a chronological history of the people of God; the video curriculum series on sin being used by adult Sunday School classes (receiving good feedback on this); and baptism preparation classes with seven participants.

### Christian Education Commission – Becky Degan

**Things completed:** Easter worship service. **Current matters:** Incorporating people, including newcomers, who have offered to use their gifts in worship; assisting the MYF in planning for Youth Sunday and their summer service trip to Chicago.

### Children and Youth Programming – Janette Lile

**Things completed:** KfC met for the last time in this church year; will resume meeting in October. **Current matters:** Organizing an added KfC program for 3 and 4-year-olds for the fall; assisting the MYF in planning for Youth Sunday and their upcoming lunch and auction; planning for VBS in July; and working with a committee on a playground proposal.

### Care Team – Nina Harnish

**Things completed:** Many calls and visits and one funeral; organized the Wednesday evening sermon discussion series led by Dan Hess. **Current matters:** Obtaining technology for adult Sunday School rooms as needed; assisting Cody Hurst in organizing a young adult service trip to Puerto Rico in July (six confirmed participants, more pending); working with MOMS program to discern its future; planning for adult summer Sunday School elective; working with Pastor Jon on church-wide visioning process; assisting in integration of new families. (Sixty + new persons have joined us for worship in the past year and a half. A new members Sunday will be scheduled sometime this fall.) Nina also expressed appreciation for the Care Fund that allows the church to help address needs that arise within the congregation.

### Mission and Service Commission – Tom Verghese

**Completed matters:** Lots of individuals and groups are going on service trips. **Current matters:** More service trips being planned; anticipating continued opportunities for service with the forecast of an active hurricane season; and planning for a mission weekend in October with Mennonite Mission Network representation.

### Staff Relations Committee – Evanna Hess

Evanna informed Council that church administrator Norma Stauffer has given notice of her intention to retire at the end of February 2019.

### Discernment Committee – Ryan Nolt

**Current matters:** Committee will begin its work for the 2018-19 church year in the near future.

### Property Committee – Norma Stauffer, on behalf of the Committee

**Things completed:** Nursery carpet professionally cleaned; kitchen professionally stripped and waxed; two HVAC units repaired; new copier purchased; foyer restrooms, trim work and ceiling tiles painted; rubber roof section repairs to address leaks; security system problems addressed; and contract signed with High Services for weed control and landscaping maintenance. **Current matters:** One HVAC system needs to be replaced; new flooring will be installed in the church office; and possible replacement of the rubber roof.

**FINANCIAL REPORT** – Treasurer Sam Clement expressed gratitude that giving continues to run above budget. Expenses are running on target with budget.

**PLAYGROUND PROPOSAL** – Janette Lile presented a proposal that was prepared by a committee that did extensive research on options. Council affirmed the proposal. Information will be shared with the congregation for feedback in the very near future.

## **OTHER UPDATES**

- Pastor Jon reported on a recent Staff Retreat Day held at the Hertzog Homestead. Input, led by Brethren in Christ Church leader Christine Sharp, was on a strengths-based leadership model. Focus was given to staff-led vs. volunteer-led church programs.
- Pastor Jon also shared results of the recent Worship Survey and the lunch group discussion that followed. Approximately 100 people participated in the survey with many preference differences expressed. While most folks agreed that they prefer blended music for worship, opinions on what that would look like were significantly varied. Worship Commission continues to experiment with the placement of the piano on and off the stage.
- Nina presented a proposal for a new Adult Education Working Group. This group would help plan programs such as Winter Bible School, the summer Sunday School elective, and Wednesday evening Bible studies. The Discernment Committee will look for volunteers to serve on this team for the coming church year.
- Jerry Lile and Rod Lefever reported that feedback on the proposed Lancaster Mennonite School Church Partnership Scholarship Program was positive, and FHMC has agreed to enter into this partnership.
- Pastor Jon and several Council members have been working on an Organization Review and Update Project that will address the differences between governance and programming. Continued work will need to be done on this project before it is ready for Council review and church approval.
- Staff Relations Committee Chair Evanna Hess presented a Sexual Misconduct Policy that was approved by Council.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION** – Evanna Hess provided an update from the Staff Relations Committee.
